History of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority was founded January 16,1920 on the campus of Howard University in Washington, D.C. by five women. These women seeking to depart from traditional coalitions for Black women established a new organization predicated on the ideals of Scholarship, Service, Sisterhood and Finer Womanhood.

We are:

The FIRST Greek-letter organization to charter a chapter in Africa (1948) The FIRST Greek-letter organization to have adult and youth auxiliary groups (Amicae, Zeta Male Network, Pearlettes, Amicettes and Archonettes). The ONLY Sorority constitutionally bound to a brother group, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Incorporated.

Alpha Phi Zeta Chapter History

The Premiere Chapter

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Incorporated has been present in Virginia since the 1920's with Nu Chapter at VUU and Phi Chapter at VSU. Alpha Phi Zeta chapter was chartered by women of Zeta in February 27,1942 at the Richmond YWCA. The charter members were comprised of 14 young women from Richmond and surrounding areas, their names:

Cotillion/Debutante Ball

A cotillion or débutante ball in the United States is a formal presentation of young ladies, débutantes, to "polite society," typically hosted by a charity or society. The ladies introduced can vary from the ages of 16 to 21.

The first Zeta cotillion program was initially held by Kappa Zeta Chapter in 1933. Chapter members: Helen Wilson Johnson and Mildred Davis then introduced the idea at the 1933 sorority national convention, it was then adopted as a national program and implemented by chapters of the sorority across the country.

Alpha Phi Zeta Chapter Debutante Program

In 1950, Alpha Phi Zeta Chapter began a Cotillion and Charm School program in Richmond Virginia. This program eventually was titled "Continental Moods in Blue and White" and became the chapters signature cotillion program.

The cotillion served as a mentoring program encouraging lady-like and scholarly behaviors. The young ladies were then presented to the Richmond Community in a Cotillion, a formal ball. In 2015, the cotillion ball adopted the title "Blue Revue" in parallel with the national cotillion program that was established in 1933 and has been implemented across the country.

Through their fundraising efforts, the debutantes compete for the opportunity to be crowned as the "Cotillion Queen". The Debutante with the highest total funds raised to benefit Alpha Phi Zeta's Health and Education Fund wins the title. Additionally, awards are presented for the second and third runner-up positions, as well as "Miss Personality"

Mission and Purpose

The <u>mission</u> of the Debutante Cotillion program is to promote Zeta Phi Beta Sorority Incorporated's ideals of Scholarship, Service, Sisterhood and Finer Womanhood through encouragement and development.

The <u>purpose</u> of the program is to fundraise in support of Alpha Phi Zeta Chapter's Health and Education Fund. This Fund awards scholarships to assist worthy young ladies in meeting their financial obligations while enrolled in institutions of higher education.

Program Goals

Program Requirement

- Eligibility Criteria:
 - ✓ Sophomore, junior or senior in good standing with their high school
- Participate Fee: \$400 -includes all activities, workshops, pictures, dance rehearsals, participant polos, etc.
- Debutantes are responsible for the cost of their dress, shoes, accessories, and other expenses
 related to the attire for the ball.
- Deposit: \$75 non-refundable (due by October 15th)
- Flexible Payment Plan available: Can be discussed individually with the cotillion Chairperson.
 Ex. plan
 - 1st installment \$120 (due by October 29th)
 - > 2nd installment of \$120 (due by November 11th)
 - Final payment of \$85 (due by November 30th)

- Approved Long White Ball Gown
- Long White Gloves
- White Shoes and hose
- Appropriate Accessories

Crowning of the Debutante

The Debutante with the highest amount of funds raised for Alpha Phi Zeta's Scholarship Fund wins the title-Miss Blue Revue.

The Debutante collecting the second highest amount of funds will be First Runner Up.

The Debutante collecting the third highest amount of funds will be the Second Runner Up.

The Queen, First Runner Up and Second Runner up will receive 10% of their total funds raised. The Debutantes will also select a Miss Personality. New this year we will award the debutant with the most community hours the title of Miss Community Service.
